Submission Types

The conference is accepting submissions for the following presentation types:

1. **Oral Presentation**
2. **Workshop / Colloquia**
3. **Poster Presentation**

Oral Presentations – 30 minutes

All oral presentations should be a total of 30 minutes which consists of 20 minutes presentation, 5 minutes Q&A and 5 minutes to move between rooms/presentations.

Workshop / Colloquia – 60, 90 or 120 minutes

All workshops and colloquia should be a total of either 60, 90 or 120 minutes (including time for Q&A and movement between rooms/presentations) and aimed at providing opportunities for panel and audience participation, or shared presentations, interaction and discussion around a theme or topic.

Poster Presentations

All posters will be on display throughout the conference as well as having dedicated author presentation / Q&A times. All posters are to be A0 in size, displayed as portrait or landscape, and printed by the author/presenter.

Submission Process

To submit an abstract using the online submission system, please follow the directions below.

Please use Internet Explorer to submit all abstracts. Other web browsers may not support the abstract submission process.

Either log in using your existing email address and password, or if you have never submitted an abstract through AUT Hospitality Services, create your account.

In the 'Create Account Page' ensure that you add all your name, affiliation, email address and other required information (marked with a *) before uploading your abstract. This enables the conference organisers to keep track of individual authors and their abstracts. Ensure the email address you include is the one you want the organiser to communicate with you about your submission and ultimately, the final result.

Ensure you enter the author first, and all co-authors second, along with relevant information required including who will present. Presenters will need to register for the conference.

Select the relevant strand and enter your abstract title. Next, to avoid a time out issue, it is recommended that you either copy and paste your abstract into the relevant field, or upload a Word or PDF copy. Note, the maximum word count is 300 (4,000 characters). Continue to select your presentation type and enter any relevant keywords (maximum of 10). Continue to answer the following questions.

You'll then have the chance to review your details and if correct, click the 'save changes' button to submit your abstract. You will shortly receive an automatic confirmation of acceptance. If you do not receive this, your abstract has not been submitted.

Note: the information that is given on the online submission should be full and correct. Whatever is submitted will be used in the conference proceedings and the conference organiser cannot take responsibility of quality checking affiliation names for spelling accuracy.

Acceptance Process

Presenters with accepted abstracts will be notified by the date previously indicated and should register before the early bird deadline to make the most of the reduced registration rate, although this is not compulsory. However, in order to be included in the conference proceedings and the final programme, all abstract presenters with accepted abstracts will need to register no later than Monday 06 November, 2017. The conference organisers reserve the right to remove anyone from the conference proceedings and the final programme who has not registered by this date.
